24 25	AFFECTED PORTIONS OF MUTCD: Sections 2B.17, 6F.12 and 7B.10
25 26	DISCUSSION/QUESTION:
27	DISCUSSION QUESTION.
28	The 2009 MUTCD in Section 2B.17 indicates a SHALL condition for the installation of
29	the BEGIN HIGHER FINES ZONE (R2-10) sign or FINES HIGHER (R2-6P) PLAQUE
30	where increased fines are imposed for traffic violations with a designated zone of a
31	roadway. Also, the END HIGHER FINES ZONE (R2-11) sign is also required.
32	
33	Section 6F.12 indicates that the BEGIN HIGHER FINES ZONE (R2-10) sign and END
34	HIGHER FINES ZONE (R2-11) should be installed when fines are increased in work
35	zones for traffic violations. This contradicts Section 2B.17 which is a SHALL condition.

44	Since many states have higher fines by statute in school zones, work zones and other
45	locations this places an undo burden on states and municipalities to sign for every

location where there are increased fines and there should be engineering judgment 46 47 involved. 48 49 The NPA Section 2B.17 had these signs as options. The Council approved that language on 1-12-08. The Council approved Section 7B.09 on 1-11-08 as an option statement. 50 51 FHWA changed it to a SHALL condition. It was placed in Section 7B.10 of the 2009 52 MUTCD. 53 54 55 56 **RECOMMENDATION:** 57 58 Change Section 2B.17, 7B.10 and 7B.15 to a should condition rather than a SHALL 59 condition for this engineering judgement as a should condition. If used, the FINES HIGHER plaque shall be mounted below an applicable 75 regulatory or warning sign in a temporary traffic control zone, a school zone, or other 76 applicable designated zone. 77 If an R2-10 sign or an R2-6P plaque is posted to provide notice of increased fines 78 for traffic violations, an END HIGHER FINES ZONE (R2-11) sign (see Figure 2B-3) shall 79 should be installed at the downstream end of the zone to provide notice to road users of 80 the termination of the increased fines zone. 81 Guidance: 82 If used, Tthe BEGIN HIGHER FINES ZONE sign or FINES HIGHER plaque should be 83 located at the beginning of the temporary traffic control zone, school zone, or other 84 applicable designated zone and just beyond any interchanges, major intersections, or 85 other major traffic generators. 86 Standard:

The Higher Fines signs and plaque shall have a black legend and border on a white rectangular background. All supplemental plagues mounted below the Higher Fines signs and plaque shall have a black legend and border on a white rectangular background.

91 92 93	The FINES HIGHER plaque shall be mounted below an applicable regulatory or warning sign in a temporary traffic control zone, a school zone, or other applicable designated zone.
94 95 96 97 98 99	Guidance: 05 Agencies should limit the use of the Higher Fines signs and plaque to locations where work is actually underway, or to locations where the roadway, shoulder, or other conditions, including the presence of a school zone and/or a reduced school speed limit zone, require a speed reduction or extra caution on the part of the road user. (Move this paragraph to above paragraph 4 with other guidance statements)
100 101 102	Option: 06 Alternate legends such as BEGIN (or END) DOUBLE FINES ZONE may also be used for the R2-10 and R2-11 signs.
103 104 105	The legend FINES HIGHER on the R2-6P plaque may be replaced by FINES DOUBLE (R2-6aP), \$XX FINE (R2-6bP), or another legend appropriate to the specific regulation (see <u>Figure 2B-3</u>).

191 192 193 194 195 196	Option: 10- 11 Changeable message signs (see <u>Chapter 2L</u> and <u>Section 6F.60</u>) may be used to inform drivers of the school speed limit. If the sign is internally illuminated, it may have a white legend on a black background. Changeable message signs with flashing beacons may be used for situations where greater emphasis of the special school speed limit is needed.
197 198 199 200 201 202	Guidance: 11-12 Even though it might not always be practical because of special features to make changeable message signs conform in all respects to the standards in this Manual for fixed-message signs, during the periods that the school speed limit is in effect, their basic shape, message, legend layout, and colors should comply with the standards for fixed-message signs.
203 204	12-13 A confirmation light or device to indicate that the speed limit message is in operation should be considered for inclusion on the back of the changeable message sign.
205 206 207	Standard: 13-14 Fluorescent yellow-green pixels shall be used when the "SCHOOL" message is displayed on a changeable message sign for a school speed limit.
208 209 210	Option: 14 15 Changeable message signs may use blank-out messages or other methods in order to display the school speed limit only during the periods it applies.
211 212	15 16 Changeable message signs that display the speed of approaching drivers (see Section 2B.13) may be used in a school speed limit zone.
213 214	16 17 A Speed Limit Sign Beacon (see <u>Section 4L.04</u>) also may be used, with a WHEN FLASHING legend, to identify the periods that the school speed limit is in effect.
